On 12 February, the <u>Centre for Innovation and Intellectual Property</u> of the Facultés universitaires Saint-Louis in Brussels (FUSL – Académie Louvain), jointly with the <u>Institute for European Legal Studies (IEJE)</u> of the University of Liege (ULg), will hold in Brussels a half-day conference entitled "The Google Book Settlement - The Challenge of Building a Digital Library that Benefits All".
