



'big data protection' rights

- * consent and withdrawn at any time (Art 7 GDPR)
- * info on '[logic of] automated decision making' (Art 13(2)(f))
- * right to erasure/ right to be forgotten (Art 17)
- * profiling (Art 22)
- * right to portability (Art 20)

Article 20 Right to data portability

- * to receive the personal data concerning him or her, which he or she has provided to a controller, in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format
- * to transmit those data to another controller without hindrance if processing
 - * based on consent or on a contract; and
 - * carried out by automated means
- * to have the personal data transmitted directly from one controller to another, where technically feasible
- * does not apply to processing based on public interest or official authority vested in the controller
